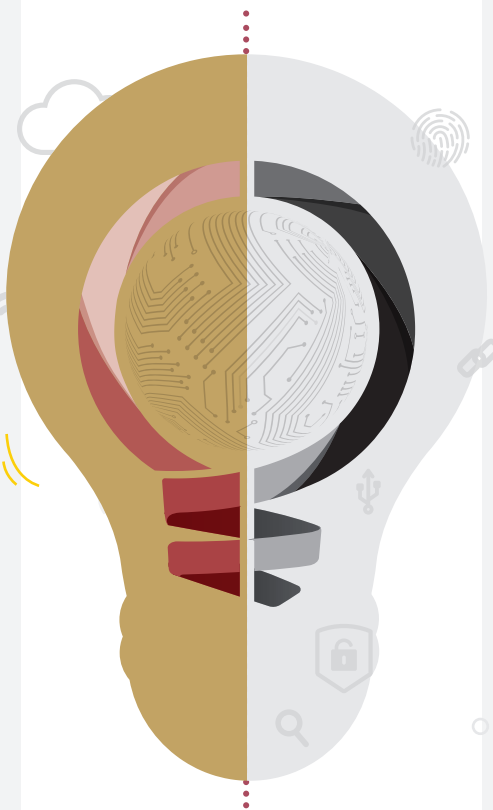

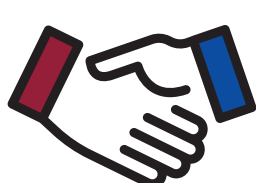

The PRIDA action aims at enabling the African continent to reap the benefits of digitalization by addressing various dimensions of broadband demand and supply in Africa and building the capacities of AU Member States in the Internet Governance space.



OBJECTIVES

PRIDA aspires to create harmonised and enabling rules and regulations for the use of **Information and Communication Technology (ICT) as a driver of social and economic development**, with an emphasis on **boosting the radio spectrum market across Africa**.

Developing a continental platform for reflecting the PRIDA deliverables and for exchange of Information and best practices among African Experts and policy makers

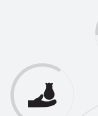

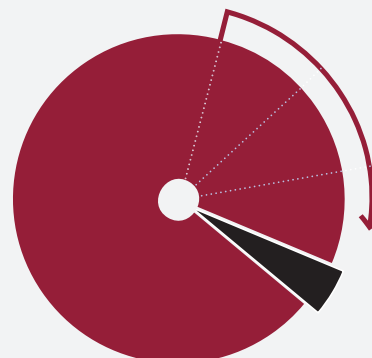
The African Union Commission (AUC), through its Department of Infrastructure and Energy (DIE) - Information Society Division (ISD)

Budgets



The EU-funded Pan African Programme, **Amount: 7.5 Mo€**

In addition to a specific contribution to the African Union Budget to the level of around 1 Mo€ per year for three years **(hence ~10.5 Mo€ in total)**.

The ITU, **Amount: 500.000 EUR**
