I. INTRODUCTION

Train the Trainer (ToT) workshop on Internet Governance track of the Policy and Regulation Initiative for Digital Africa (PRIDA) was held on the 27th to 31st May 2019 in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. It was attended by roughly 70 participants from 33 countries. Participant included focal points of the PRIDA project, national and regional IGF coordinators/conveners and other selected participants representing African Internet stakeholder groups (public sector, civil society, business community and academia) from member states of the African Union.

The workshop was conducted using 11 modules comprising:

- Module 1: Overview of Internet Governance Concepts, Institutions and Historical perspective
- Module 2: Techniques for mapping internet Governance Issues, Stakeholders and decisionmaking points
- Module 3: internet infrastructure, architecture, standards, codes, and protocols
- Module 4: cybersecurity and critical infrastructure protection
- Module 5: legal and regulatory aspects of internet governance
- Module 6: the digital economy and internet governance
- Module 7: ICT in development, digital policies, and internet governance
- Module 8: Socio-cultural aspect of internet governance
- Module 9: the rights aspects of internet governance
- Module 10: mapping internet governance institutions and stakeholders
- Module 11: addressing internet governance issues in Africa- strategies towards a common regional position.

An evaluation was conducted to ascertain participants' satisfaction of the training modules based on the *Content*, *Trainers* and *Practical Exercises* of the modules carried out during the training. The evaluation also sought recommendations and suggestions from participants on the workshop. A grading scale from 1 - 5 was used to allow participants to indicate their satisfaction on the content, trainers and practical exercises of the modules during the workshop. On the whole 54 of the participants submitted their completed evaluation forms. The following is the grading scale used for the evaluation:

1- Poor; 2- Fair; 3- Good; 4- Very Good; 5- Excellent

II. ANYLYSIS OF FEEDBACK ON WORKSHOP EVALUATION CRITERIA

Generally, on the **Content** for the workshop, an average of 22.45 respondents representing 41 percent of the participants replied that the content of the 11 modules was very good and 13.91 respondents representing 26 percent responded with excellent overall content. Only 1.09 respondents representing 2 percent believed that the 11 modules had poor content.

With regard to **Trainers**, an average of 20.18 respondents representing 38 percent of the participants thought that the Trainers for the workshop were very good and delivered well and 14.73 respondents representing 27 percent of the participants said that the Trainers were excellent for the workshop. Only 0.45 respondents representing 1 percent believed that the trainers were poor.

As far as the **Practical Exercises** are concerned, 20.45 respondents representing 38 percent of the participants responded that the practical exercises were very good and 14.73 respondents representing 28 percent of the participants thought that the Practical Exercises were excellent. Only 0.4 respondents on the average representing 1 percent of the participant believed that the practical exercises were poor.




Figure 1:: Graphical representation of the average respondents to the evaluation of the Content




Figure 2: Graphical representation of the average respondents to the evaluation of the Trainers





Figure 3: Graphical representation of the average respondents to the evaluation of the Practical Exercises

III. ANYLYSIS OF FEEDBACK ON INDIVIDUAL WORKSHOP MODULES


Module 1: Overview of Internet Governance Concepts, Institutions and Historical perspective On the Content in module 1, 46.3 percent of the participants responded that the content was very good and 21.1 percent thought it was excellent. Only 1.9 percent of the participants believed it was poor. The Table and figure below show the participants' response to module 1 content.






Module 2: Techniques for mapping internet Governance Issues, Stakeholders and decisionmaking points






Module 3: internet infrastructure, architecture, standards, codes, and protocols




Module 5: legal and regulatory aspects of internet governance


Module 7: ICT in development, digital policies, and internet governance








Module 11: addressing internet governance issues in Africa- strategies towards a common regional position.





IV. RECOMMENDATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS BY WORKSHOP PARTICIPANTS

Participants recommended that more time should be allocated for discussions and practical exercises on all modules. They also suggested that the practical exercises must be specific with more clarity. On the breakout discussions, the respondents advocated that there should be balance in terms of gender and expertise within groups. In this regard, respondents also suggested more African data and context for the group discussions.

V. CONCLUSION

Nearly 80% of participants completed the evaluation forms and rated the *Content*, *Trainers* and *Practical Exercises*.

Averaging across all modules, nearly 67% though that the training *Content* is Very Good or Excellent, while 85% said the *Content* is at minimum Good.

By the same token, approximately 65% said that the *Trainers* are Very Good or Excellent, whereas 88% believed that the *Trainers* are at minimum Good.

As for the *Practical Exercises*, 66% of respondents believed that they are Very Good or Excellent. 87% responded that the *Practical Exercises* are at minimum Good.

The received evaluation feedback is generally encouraging and the majority of respondents felt that the workshop by and large has achieved its intended goals. However, the respondents thought that more time should be allocated to discussions and practical exercises. Furthermore, the respondents suggested that more African data and context ought to be included in the group discussions.
