



#### **IMO Conventions**

- More than 50 international conventions and protocols
- Three main categories:
  - Maritime safety
  - Marine pollution
  - liability and compensation
- Three main conventions:
  - International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS)
  - International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL)
  - International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers (STCW)



#### The International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers

- Adopted on 7 July 1978 and entered into force on 28 April 1984
- 167 States are Party to the STCW 1978 Convention
- Supplemented by the Seafarers' Training, Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW) Code
  - part A, mandatory provisions
  - part B, recommended guidance



#### **Key provisions of the STCW Convention**

- Communication of information (Regulation I/7)
   (MSC.1/Circ.1163/Rev.13 refers)
- Quality standards (Regulation I/8)
   (MSC.1/Circ.1164/Rev.26 refers)
- Certificates and endorsements (Regulation I/2) (validity and authenticity <u>check</u>)
- Control (Article X)

#### **Chapter IV - Radiocommunication and radio operators**

- Applies to radio operators on GMDSS-compliant ships only.
- Sets the minimum criteria for the certification of GMDSS radio operators.
- Requires radio operators to hold an appropriate radio operator according to the provisions of the <u>Radio Regulations</u>.
- Provisions of Chapter IV are supported by STCW Code Part A and Part B.

### STCW Code, Part A, Chapter IV (Standards regarding radio operators)

- Set out the minimum <u>mandatory</u> requirements for certification of a GMDSS radio operator.
- Outlines two competencies to:
  - Transmit and receive information using GMDSS sub-systems and equipment, and fulfilling the functional requirements of GMDSS;
     and
  - provide radio services in emergencies

#### STCW Code, Part B, Chapter IV (Guidance regarding radiocommunication and radio operators)

Outlines the scope of the training required for REO, GOC and ROC
